Chateau Vignot St. Emilion Grand Cru 2004

Deep ruby red color. The nose is wonderfully fragrant focused on rich, ripe and dried fruits accented by hints of toasted almond, nutmeg, roasted fennel, and vanilla. The palate is incredibly evolved for a Bordeaux in the prime of its youth offering a lush, silky texture and soft tannins that frame the currant and cherry flavors. Great length and perfect balance encourage immediate gratification - the sensible price is equally impressive. **\$35**



Lassègue St. Emilion Grand Cru 2004

Deep, ruby red to purple color. Incredibly complex aromatics feature scents of crushed blackberry, anise, plum, cassis, black pepper and earth. The palate confirms the nose being generous while firm with a sturdy tannic edge suggesting that while pleasing now, this wine will do well with another five years, or more, of cellar time. A harmonious marriage of fruit, spice, and earth. **\$50**
